Part Four- Called to Become February 18, 2024

For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul?

1) To truly delight in the Lord, our goal is to <u>become more like Christ</u> every day.

2) To become more like God, we need <u>to know</u> <u>who He is.</u>

For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

3.) To become more like God, we need to <u>think</u> and act like Him.
