Part 1: Come and See

HOW DO WE GET USED TO DIFFERENT IN 2022?

The following day [the day after Jesus got baptized] John was again standing with two of his disciples. [John had people who were following him.] As Jesus walked by, John looked at him and declared, “look! There is the lamb of God!”

(John 1:35-36, New Living Translation)

“It is not possible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.”

(Hebrews 10:4, NLT)

1. Accept Jesus’ forgiveness

This is real love—not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins.

(1 John 4:10, NLT)

“To all who believed him and accepted him, he gave the right to become children of God.”

(John 1:12, NLT)

When John’s two disciples heard this, they followed Jesus.

Jesus looked around and saw them following. “What do you want?” he asked them.

They replied, “Rabbi” (which means “Teacher”), [in fact, if you go into a Jewish synagogue today, their leader is called a “Rabbi”] “where are you staying?”

“Come and see,” he said.

It was about four o’clock in the afternoon when they went with him to the place where he was staying, and they remained with him the rest of the day.

(John 1:37-39, NLT)

2. Start following Jesus today.

Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, was one of these men who heard what John said and then followed Jesus. Andrew went to find his brother, Simon, and told him, “We have found the Messiah” (which means “Christ”).

(John 1:37–41, NLT)
